This week in Kindergarten we have been hard at work! In reading we have been focusing on comparing and contrasting fictional and nonfictional texts, as well as identifying the author's purpose in the story. In math Ms. Yamnitz and Ms. Haecherl's classes have continued their practice with subtraction and addition, and Ms. McGee and Ms.

Menoff's classes are wrapping up their unit on time. In science we have been learning about plants and participating in Earth Day activities! In social studies we are finishing up our learning on traditions and cultures. Reminder: Our LEGOLAND field trip is quickly approaching. In Ms. Swank's and Ms. Anderson's class, in writing, we will began the week by reading "The Lorax" by Dr. Seuss, and the students have used the writing process to write an informative lesson about ways that can help the Earth/ what they would do if they were The Lorax. The coincides with Earth Day on Saturday, 4/22. Our phonics study has looked at words with /ow/ and the schwa sound ('a' pronounced "uh", like in the word "across."). In reading, we have focused on the nonfiction text, "Working Together," about animal partnerships. Our reading skill practice has focused on identifying author's reasons and synthesizing information. Our grammar focus skill is future tense verbs. In science, we have been celebrating Earth Day with many fun activities and crafts, and learning about ways to care for our Earth and why this is important. We will go on a nature walk around the school. In math we are reviewing methods of solving word problems.

Class are also working on Earth day in Science as well as writing. We are discussing ways to help the earth by using the "3 R's"; Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle. In spelling we have been studying ways to make the long "u" sound and we are reading leveled books that help us become fluent readers. We are just starting our math unit on fractions by dividing shapes into equal parts.

This week was the K-2 Spelling Bee. Each class was given a spelling test, and the top 2 spellers were sent to the Bee. From Ms. Alfiky's class, the contestants were Madhay and Rachel, From Ms. Haines class were Tiana and Rashed, From Mrs. Nelson's class was Ananya and Janvi. From Mrs. Bonnell's class were Eric and Jade. We were so proud to see our very own 2nd grader, Rachel from Ms. Alfiky's class, win the Spelling Bee! Congrats to her and to all the contestants on a job well done!

Mrs. Bonnell's class has been working hard on perfecting their writing skills, specifically planning and proper paragraph format. For the past few weeks, they have been practicing how to plan and write for a one paragraph opinion paper. This week, the students are in the beginning stages of writing a three paragraph expository paper. They are very excited to show off their new skills in the coming weeks. In math, they have been reviewing this year's math skills before moving onto basic multiplication. In science,

they are comparing the similarities and differences in the needs of plants, animals, and humans. In social studies, we are focusing on culture and comparing other cultures to our own.

On Friday, the music teacher, Ms. Parrella, is taking grades K-2 on a field trip to see the Orlando Philharmonic Orchestra. We are looking forward to a fabulous time listening to wonderful music!









4th Grade

Mrs. Anderson's and Miss Chardavoyne's students are continuing to work hard preparing for the Math FSA by working in math centers. Our centers are baseball themed, and students placed into MLB teams. Each student earns points for the center work which showcases their skills, along with teamwork/behavior points. As part of the FSA review centers, teams are completing an FSA review packet. Our competition is close—the Detroit Tigers fell out of the lead to the New York Mets. We are eager to see which team will win the ballpark lunch party! We feel confident about our upcoming FSA test and will surely knock it out of the park.

Mrs. Anderson's friends are beginning their poetry unit by creating poetry books with examples of each style. We have

learned Cinquain' Limerick, and Haiku so far. We are also closing our Plants and Animals units in science, along with finishing our unit on Florida's Industry in Social Studies.

Ms. Thomas' class has been very busy this week! In Reading, they continued to review for FSA, as well as with the novel study of Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children. In Math, they have continued their study of the multiplication of decimal numbers. In Science, they discussed the difference between inherited and learned behaviors. In Social Studies, they discussed the effects of World War I upon the state of Florida. Our class would like to congratulate Nandana for placing in 2nd during the 3-5 Spelling Bee! We would also like to recognize Brooklynn for competing in the Spelling Bee. Both ladies did a great job spelling and representing our class!

Ms. Hurley's class is continuing our study of volume in Mathematics. In Social Studies we are moving on to studying about WWII. In Science we have been taking some extra time learning about the difference between traits and learned behaviors through interactive notebook entries. We are continuing our study of poetry in reading and writing. This week we wrote content based Acrostic poems while still working on our Memoir projects. Please do not forget that they are due on May 1st! We are halfway through Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children and the students are thoroughly enjoying it. Please be sure that your child is reading the chapters if they are out from school. Congratulations to Luca and Aaditya for making it to the school wide spelling bee!


We are ready for the another fantastic start! Keep practicing on the new projects and learning new things:)

My Kindergarten students are developing their motor skills with the use of the computer mouse practically as well as they started using Starfall for reading book online.







Dear OSES Families,

Orlando Science Charter School is excited to offer STEM summer learning opportunities for our students.

STEM Camps will be held for four weeks this summer, June 5-9, June 12-16, July 10-14, and July 17-21 from 9:00-4:00. Each week of camp will cost \$200 per student. For families with more than one child attending, each additional student will be charged \$150 to attend camp. Students may attend either one, two, three, or four weeks (each week will vary by activities). Half- day or single-day camp is not offered this year. Space is limited, so camp enrollment will be first come, first served basis. A daily snack will be provided for each student; however, they are responsible for bringing their own lunch each day.

Students must be dropped off through the cafeteria no earlier than 8:30am. Pick up will also take place in the cafeteria and students must be picked up no later than 4:30 pm.

While on campus students will be required to abide by the OSES code of conduct. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from camp.

Dress Code: OSES uniform is not required; however, the following items will not be permitted: Tight pants, shorts that are shorter than fingertip length, offensive t-shirts, spaghetti strap or halter style tops. This is mandated by administration and will not be permitted while on campus.
