# Kindergarten

Another week has come and gone! Ms. Haecherl's class received their chicken egg incubator this week! All classes are anxiously awaiting the hatching of the chicks. Kindergarten has finished its unit on life cycles and has moved onto sound and vibrations in science. In social studies, the students are working on personal histories and how we can learn about the past.

We are coming to the end of the year and our field trip to Legoland approaches quickly! Just a reminder that all permission slips and money are due next Friday, May 5th. In First Grade writing, the students paired up to read a biography of a famous/influential American, then write a brief biography, and create a statue to commemorate the person. Our phonics study looked at words with words with various prefixes and suffixes. In

reading, we focused on the nonfiction text, "Apply Pie 4th of July" and "A Picnic in October" - these helped to introduce our new unit, all about America and its people. Our reading skill practice focused on identifying characters' feelings. Our grammar focus skill was prepositions.

## 1st Grade

Our social studies activities for the week investigated symbols of America. In math, we continued a review of all math skills learned throughout the year, focusing on analyzing word problems.

# This week, Mrs. Nelson's class created preposition comic strips. After learning about prepositions and prepositional phrases, students created a comic strip that included several prepositions. Students then had a chance to share their comic with the class. After each presentation, the class identified examples of preposi-

### 4th Grade

4th grade has been very busy this week! Mrs. Anderson's and Ms. Charavoyne's classes took the Math FSA on Monday and Tuesday. Both classes also finished their Math FSA review centers. The Chicago Cubs won for best teamwork, participation, and behavior. Students in this group were rewarded with an ice cream party on Wednesday to celebrate. In Ms. Chardavoyne's class, students have been discussing Florida industries and how transportation helped increase the population. Students worked in partners to create vintage Florida postcards. 14 students were rewarded with a donut party for gaining 50% of the blue ribbons in either Math or Reading Study Island assignments. Congratulations! Mrs. Anderson's class began an new unit on biomes and ecosystems, and completed a research WebQuest to learn more about these concepts. They also participated in an area and perimeter area activity involving Cheez-Its. They are continuing their poetry study and discovering new ways to interpret poetry. Their memoir projects are due next week and they are

looking forward to the class presentations! Ms. Thomas' class started a new unit on dividing decimals in Math. They are continuing their novel study of Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children. They have also been working on several exciting project! The first project is the Big Dreams Project, in which students are researching college and career aspirations! They began by taking a personal career aptitude test to get an idea for what kind of career options they might be interested in; they then researched the five best colleges in the country for those options. The second project is an in-depth study of the human body! They spent this week learning about the circulatory system. Students are now able to explain the difference between oxygenated and deoxygenated blood, as well as how blood flows through the human heart and travels through the blood. Students were fascinated to learn that it is possible through technology to keep a human heart beating outside of the body! Wow! 15 students in the class were also rewarded with a pizza party this week in order to celebrate getting blue ribbons on 100% of their Study Island assignments in Math and Reading! Way to go!





Dear OSES Families,

Orlando Science Charter School is excited to offer STEM summer learning opportunities for our students.

STEM Camps will be held for four weeks this summer, June 5-9, June 12-16, July 10-14, and July 17-21 from 9:00-4:00. Each week of camp will cost \$200 per student. For families with more than one child attending, each additional student will be charged \$150 to attend camp. Students may attend either one, two, three, or four weeks (each week will vary by activities). Half- day or single-day camp is not offered this year. Space is limited, so camp enrollment will be first come, first served basis. A daily snack will be provided for each student; however, they are responsible for bringing their own lunch each day.

Students must be dropped off through the cafeteria no earlier than 8:30am. Pick up will also take place in the cafeteria and students must be picked up no later than 4:30 pm.

While on campus students will be required to abide by the OSES code of conduct. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from camp.

Dress Code: OSES uniform is not required; however, the following items will not be permitted: Tight pants, shorts that are shorter than fingertip length, offensive t-shirts, spaghetti strap or halter style tops. This is mandated by administration and will not be permitted while on campus.
