

2nd Grade

On Thursday, author Kentrell Martin visited our school. Students listened to one of his stories and learned several words in American Sign Language. After the presentation, students had the opportunity to ask Mr. Martin questions and talk to him about their own writing.













1st Grade

Ms. Anderson's class is learning how to partition shapes and identify the angles and sides on shapes in math. In Reading, they are learning how to identify cause and effect and working on irregular past tense verbs. In social studies, they are learning how the past is different from today.

In Ms. Swank's class, in writ-

ing, the students used the writing process to write an opinion piece about a super power that they would like to have, with supporting reasons, and opening and closing sentences. Our phonics study will look at vowel digraphs oo, ea, aw, au. In reading, we focused on the nonfiction text, "Enric Sala -Marine Ecologist." Along with this story, many of our activities throughout the week focused on marine and aquatic life - concluding with fun activities and friendship-building activities relate to the loved story, "The Rainbow Fish". Our reading skill practice will focused synthesizing information and cause and effect. Our grammar focus skill was regular and irregular past tense verbs. In science, we focused on food chains, and Then the students created their own food chains! In math, we continue to study geometry and the characteristics of various 2 and 3 dimensional shapes.

This week 3rd grade is continuing to learn how plants adapt to survive during the different seasons. They have started a biography project and have started researching the person that they have chosen. Mrs. Silvares'


class started rotational novel studies where students read different novels in groups and then work with their group to discuss literary elements. Mrs. Cybulski's class has also started a novel study and will be exploring dif-

ferent elements in literacy groups. In math, all classes are reviewing all standards to prepare for the upcoming FSA.

5th Grade

5th grade is preparing to take the FSA. Mrs. Culverwell and Ms. Farrell's classes are taking their reading and math tests next week. Please make sure students are well rested and eat a good breakfast before testing! Good luck 5th grade!











4th Grade

Mrs. Anderson and Miss Chardavoyne's class have teamed up together to get ready for the math FSA. Everyday students work in math centers. Throughout the course of the week, students visit 5 centers. The centers focus on skills that have already been taught in class and are now being reinforced. The centers are teacher center where students work with either Mrs. Anderson or Miss Chardavoyne for oneon-one work, a teacher center with Ms. Knight where they students focus on solving word problems, an FSA center where the students work on answering questions similar to how they are asked on FSA, the "I Can..." center where students work on answering questions about topics, and the "Make it...Take it..." center where students work on a project for their interactive notebooks that help to restate topics we have reviewed. The students are put into

groups and teams. Teams are scored based on their ability to work in groups and the accuracy of their assignments. The team with the highest score will receive a special baseball themed party and the 2 highest teams will compete in a "World Series" Kickball Game. Everyone is super excited about this and the students are doing well working together and completing their math work. We will be ready on April




