In Ms. McGee and Ms. Menoff's classes they are wrapping up a review on addition and subtraction strategies before moving on to double digit addition

and subtraction. In Social Studies everyone is finishing up their chapter about maps/globes, landforms, and bodies of water. We will begin a new chapter next week about families and culture. In Science we are continuing our investigations into the

1st Grade

In Ms. Swank's first grade, in writing, the students have used the writing process to create a cinquain poem and a tercet poem. Students' completed poetry books will be coming home in the next couple of weeks. I invite you to read through the book with your child in March to celebrate National Poetry month. In reading, we will continue our unit "Better Together", and our word study will focus on words with /er/ sound-spellings (spelled ir, ur, and er). We

will practice the reading skills of finding the main idea of a passage and determining the importance of ideas in a passage. In math, we have continued studying measuring length in metric units. In social studies, we will continue and conclude chapter 4 on culture and traditions. On Thursday we went on our field trip to the Science Center for a day of hands-on science fun!

This week Ms. Strickland's class did an author study of Dr. Seuss. For reading, we reviewed facts by reading nonfiction stories about Dr. Seuss. We also revised rhyming words, and story

elements. We wrote a cinquian poem, and wrote in sequence about our Wack Wednesday. We even made a picture of some of our wacky socks! In math we started time. For science and social studies we talked about plant needs and wants and facts from history.



2nd Grade

Second grade went on their second field trip this week! Students went to the Orlando Reparatory Theater to See: Geronimo Stilton, Mouse in Space. The classes enjoyed seeing the rendition of the book on stage. Some classes had read the book beforehand, and discussed the differences and similarities

3rd Grade

In math, students are learning how to multiply decimals and how to work with mixed numbers. In Reading, students are

- 1. Go to http://www.hjeshare.com/eShare/Index.jsp or search for HJ ESHARE in the app store (Apple and Android).
- 2. School Code: OSES2017 (case sensitive!)
- 3. Fill out the acknowledgement information.
- 4. Submit up to 10 pictures at a time. Once uploaded, you will be asked for the grade level of the student(s) in the picture. If it was a multi-grade event, such as Grandparents Night, just put K-2, 3-5, etc. If it is a single grade level, just put the number (1st grade = 1). It will also ask for the names of students and a brief description. If it is a class picture, you put "______'s Class" or "Grade Level." All fields must have something.

That's it! The deadline to submit pictures will be sometime in March. But please do not wait until the last minute, as I'd like to work on the book throughout the year.
