We had an exciting second week of Kindergarten! We are working very hard on remembering the procedures and routines of the classroom and the school. In Social Studies we talked about rules and being good citizens. In Science we learned about making observations and using the scientific method. In

Math we are working with 2D or plane shapes. Some classes are also working on reviewing numbers. In Reading we are working on letter recognition, letter sounds, and sight words. 1st Grade

This week in first grade, Ms. Strickland's class read the book Bad Apple talked about being nice to each other and counted to 120 while performing assessments. In Mrs. Ortiz's class they counted to 120 by 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's! They also tasted 3 different types of apples and made a pictograph of which was their favorite. In addition, they also learned about what hap-

pens to apples after they have been mixed with different liquids. In reading they read Limelight Larry and learned how to treat others around them. Ms. Swanks class focused on learning and executing the steps of the writing process. We also began our study of various types of communities. In science, we used our senses to observe apples, and what happens to them when they are left to soak in various solutions. In social studies we discussed

what being responsible means. Finally, in math, we practiced place value. The students created their own structures using base-10 blocks, and then calculated the worth of the structure. And Lastly, Ms. Anderson's class learned about place value, making lists in writing, making observations, Rights and responsibilities and in reading, Short /a/ and short /I/ and communities. As well as answering questions about the text.

5th Grade

Thank you for those families that came out to Curriculum Night. It was a great success and it was wonderful to get to see our parents again. In Ms. Farrell's class this week students complet-

ed a STEM activity on Storm Windows using data analysis and cooperative group skills to determine the best solutions. Students did this as an introduction to collecting evidence for

arguments or persuasive writing.

Don't forget that Thursday is picture day! Information on ordering the pictures should have come home today.

2nd Grade

Second grade in Ms.
Haines' class has been filled with STEM, time, and writing! Last week, students watched raisins dance in lemon lime soda.
This week, students saved a gummy worm named Fred from a watery doom by putting a life preserver on



him using only paper clips. In math, students have been testing their fact fluency and charting their starting point on graphs, which will be updated each month

so students can set and reach fluency goals! In writing, each student chose a summer memory for our first class book.


We had a busy learning week this week!
