All four classes have been studying holidays around



1st Grade

First grade is hard at work this week. In Ms. Swank's and Ms. Anderson's class they are studying words with ow and oa, ways to be a good citizen, designed and wrote about inventions that could help our communi-

ty and practiced 3 digit addition with and without regrouping. Mrs. Parker's class is working on words with the tr and gr blend, discussing family celebrations and traditions as well as working on real world word problems for subtraction. Ms. Strickland's

class is working on compound words, sequence of events, cause and effect, visual cues and retelling familiar stories. In Science they are discussing how things move with a unit on force and motion.

This week 3rd Grade has been learning about Kindness and they had a chance to practice that through writing positive comments on the backs' of their classmates. Mrs. Silvares' and Mrs. Cybulski's classes are reading the Twits by Roald Dahl and students are thor-

oughly enjoying it. In Mrs. Silvares' class,

students made Slime and are starting a mini research project on adaptations made by Arctic animals.

Mrs. Bonnell's class is taking the challenge... The Curtis Engineering Challenge, that is! This week, the challenge was to create a "roller coaster" structure. The goal was to have a marble roll down the coaster without it falling off/ out. The students had to brainstorm a plan individually. After a few minutes, they collaborated their ideas with their group members to create one plan. The class then built their coasters out of papers and tape. The coasters could rely on another structure for support, such as a chair or being taped to the table. Two groups were successful, and the other two groups have new outlooks on how they could improve their strategies for next time. There will be 4 more challenges to complete before February 4, when teams of 5 will be chosen to compete at the Orlando Science Center Challenge, so save the date! Ms. Haines, Ms. Alfiky, and Mrs. Nelson's classes are also participating in these challenges.







In reading, the students are learning all about the morals and themes of ancient proverbs, fables, and folktales. They are enjoying the lessons the morals and themes teach and are having fun connecting the lessons to their own experiences. In math, we are continuing to practice subtracting twodigit numbers and learning different mental strategies to find their answers, such as using a number line or through regrouping. In science, we finished learning about the different states of matter and will be moving onto force/gravity and





motion! Our first experiment introducing these topics will be on Friday. In social students, the students completed a unit on services in our communities, producers and consumers, and trading and loans. As a summary of this unit, we are holding a classwide food drive. Over 50 donations have been made!

Next week is going to be an exciting week in 2nd grade, as we will be learning about different holidays around the world. Stay tuned, and have a great weekend!

4th Grade

All 4th grade classes have wrapped up their units on opinion writing and began learning about expository writing. Our big FSA Writing Test is on February 28 so we are all working very hard to ensure we are ready. All classes are also in the midst of our science unit on Earth's Resources.

Our Winter STEM day is next week Thursday, December 15th. If any parents are available to come in and enjoy the fun activities with us please sign up through ADDitions to volunteer.



Our next field trip will be to Gatorland sometime in January. More information will be sent out soon about this event. The price will be approximately \$20 (could be a little more, a definite price has not been solidified yet), just in case you want to put the money to the side in preparation.

Mrs. Anderson's friends have been practicing with factoring numbers, and are learning how to use arrays with factoring. Mrs. Anderson's class has started learning about Earth's resources, and students have been using their IANs (interactive notebooks) to learn about properties of both rocks and minerals. We started learning about the theme of a story, and used Matilda as an example to discuss many different themes found in the novel.



Ms. Hurley's class FINALLY finished Out of My Mind. The students really enjoyed this read aloud and have had many different discussions about inclusion and what real friendship is like. Reading this story was a great learning experience for the class as a whole. Our next full class read aloud will be The Phantom Tollbooth. Please send your child in with a copy by January 4th. Students can borrow it from the public library, have it on their electronic device to read or if you want to purchase a copy for them that is fine as well but not a requirement.

Specials: Young Music Makers!

This week 2nd through 5th grade students are taking their music tests. They have been working hard all quarter getting ready for their music tests. 2nd and 3rd grade are having the most fun with their tests.

3rd grade is playing in groups and performing a song for their fellow classmates to evaluate them. They are all playing different instruments and then afterwards evaluating themselves as well.

2nd grade is having a test on their unpitched instrument families. Using their listening skills and getting into pairs to give each other their tests. Students have to listening from across the room to what instrument their partner is playing an say what family it belongs to.

Ist grade has had homework for the first time this year in music class. The listened to a song in class and for homework have to draw a picture of how the song made them feel. We've had a lot of good drawings so far.

Kindergarten learned a dance all the way from Denmark last week called "Seven

Jumps" and they loved it. This week they are getting to play with Unpitched instruments and applying them to

number sequencing.

4th grade is applying their learned knowledge of "Songlifting" to their Quarter 2 test. A lot of them have been ending early because they studied so hard.

- 1. Go to http://www.hjeshare.com/eShare/Index.jsp or search for HJ ESHARE in the app store (Apple and Android).
- 2. School Code: OSES2017 (case sensitive!)
- 3. Fill out the acknowledgement information.
- 4. Submit up to 10 pictures at a time. Once uploaded, you will be asked for the grade level of the student(s) in the picture. If it was a multi-grade event, such as Grandparents Night, just put K-2, 3-5, etc. If it is a single grade level, just put the number (1st grade = 1). It will also ask for the names of students and a brief description. If it is a class picture, you put "______'s Class" or "Grade Level." All fields must have something.

That's it! The deadline to submit pictures will be sometime in March. But please do not wait until the last minute, as I'd like to work on the book throughout the year.
