
# Kindergarten



This week in Kindergarten has been another exciting and fun filled week! In reading this week we have been learning about spiders and practicing our skills of forming opinions.

In math this week we have continued our learning on comparing numbers. In science we have been determining the difference between living and nonliving things, and their role in our environment. Finally in social studies we have been learning the difference between needs and wants, and we had another exciting visit from the mounted police force this week. ## 1st Grade

Mrs. Parker's class is working on fiction and non-fiction books as well the authors purpose for writing the book. We are building our word wall by manipulating words and

changing one letter at a time to make new words. We are finishing up a unit on Bats and have talked about the food they eat as well as when and how they sleep. In science we

discussed land forms and how they change over time. Mrs. Parker is looking forward to meeting all the parents of her class Next Tuesday evening.

## 3rd Grade

This week 3rd Grade learned about gravity, story sequencing, and attributes of 2-D shapes. Mrs. Cybulski's class built gravity cars

to test the properties of gravity that they learned. Mrs. Silvares' class wrote fiction essays related to Fall and they are continu-

ing to work on their state research. Overall, it was a fantastic week for 3rd Grade.

# 2nd Grade

Mrs. Bonnell's class has had a busy yet fun week! To start with (and in honor of Halloween), the class competed in a Creepy Cookie contest, where they were given a cookie and different topping to create the creepiest cookie ever! Four finalists were chosen and the class voted for their favorite cookie out of the four. They had a



"scary" good time!

Later in the week, the Mounted Horse Unit from the Orlando Police Department came for a visit to share their horses with the students and give more information on what they do. They even let the students



pet the horse, and a lot of them commented on how warm and soft he was!

In reading, we are learning about context clues and how to use a dictionary to find multiple meanings a word might have. For math, we are using our mental addition strategies to add two-digit numbers together to find the sum. In science, we are being introduced to a new chapter: the states of matter. For social studies, we are learning about communities, good citizenship, and national symbols.



4th grade has been doing research to prepare for our upcoming St. Augustine field trip! Each class did a WebQuest to learn about St. Augustine for Social Studies.

Mrs. Anderson's friends went on a virtual tour of the Castillo San Marcos to learn about its history. We completed a math project that allowed us to design a movie theater using our knowledge of division, and wrote letters to our penpals in Missouri. We have also begun brainstorming ideas for our class book that will be published

through Student Treasures!

Ms. Chardevoyne's class used their media center time to learn about Spanish Explorers.

Ms. Thomas's class discussed main idea and details using primary sources concerning St. Augustine in their Reading block. In Math, they started a new unit on multiplying fractions. In Science, they discussed using wind and water to create electrical energy. In Writing, they are continuing to practice planning and writing an opinion essay.

Ms. Hurley's class is finishing up their Division unit and

will be taking their assessment next week. In science, they are spending time right now on heat/thermal energy and how it works. In reading, they have started a new class read aloud, "The Kid Who Ran for President" in honor of the upcoming election. They are continuing to work on plot through reading several fun stories. 


