Student Pick-Up and Drop-Off Information

Quick Reminders!

Pick-Up should not arrive on campus before the times shown below:

Grades K-5: 2:40 p.m.

Grades 6-7: 2:20 p.m.

Both Pick-Up and Drop-Off follow the same car loop shown below. Please remember that we are all in this together; kindness and respect are both important.

Students may be on campus without penalty until 4 p.m., you have the time range of 2:20 to 4 p.m. to pick up your student.

Students cannot be picked up from the Front Desk after 2 p.m. If you need to check you child out after this time arrangements must be made with Mr. Singleton directly. Students may not be checked out to avoid the carline.

Parents should not be coming to the Pick-Up Area holding signs out of their vehicles. Students are released directly to their vehicles. Parents that walk for Pick-Up will be directed to the Front Office.

We understand that the logistics are challenging right now, but if we all follow procedures accordingly some of the frustrations can be avoided. With teamwork we can accomplish anything!

Please don't turn right around the cones when you leave the school.

Please don't block our neighbors driveway at the college across the street.

Club Dismissal Reminders:

Please ensure you know your students schedule (clubs/ tutoring) and the end times. If you are unsure of your students' club schedule please contact Ms. Santiago at Ana.Santiago@orlandoscience.org

Parents should arrive to pick up no earlier than 5 minutes before club ends.

Elementary clubs and tutoring end times are:

Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays 3:35, and Wednesdays: 2:35

6th and 7th grade clubs end times are:

Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays 3:15, and Wednesdays: 2:15

Parents are welcomed to wait for their child outside in the parking area (not in the car line unless is dismissal time)

If a parent needs to do an early pickup from the club, they must come through the front desk with proper identification for pick up.

Kindergarten

Kindergarten has been working hard! It's hard to believe that the first quarter is done! In Mrs. Krygowski's and Mrs. Vinson's classes, students have been working on reading and writing words with double consonants, place value to 100, and writing with conventions. Ms. Yamnitz's and Ms. Lineberger's classes, students are working on learning their letters and sounds, how to spell basic words by sounding out, and comparing 2D and 3D shapes. All classes have been learning about maps in Social Studies and Forces (pushes and pulls) in Science.

In Second Grade, this week we have had a great time exploring our weather. This week we discovered how the season's change due to the rotation and tilt of our planet around the sun. We also learned how the water cycle is never ending! Ms. Volden's class had fun going outside and watching our puddles evaporate, and even made a cloud inside with Mrs. Chandler's class on Thursday!



STEM

The past couple of weeks in STEM has been focused on the Engineering Design Process for grades 2-5. The students have been challenged to design and build a roller coaster that has one hill one loop, and one turn. As part of this unit students learned the meaning of criteria and how constraints can affect the outcome.







3rd Grade

3rd grade had a wonderful week of fun and learning! Mrs. Cybulski and Ms. Knight's class did some epic multiplication bees to learn about sportsmanship, math, and we got some outdoor sun and exercise at the same time! Mrs. Cybulski's class presented their Array Communities, where students combined arrays with learning about urban, suburban, and rural communities. The projects were so very amazing and creative! We also made glorious art projects such as salt art and Halloween hand puppets to help us develop instruction following and creativity. Mrs. Cybulski's class also continued monitoring our mysterious mold experiment where students learn about the way mold grows and spreads. Mrs. Cybulski's class continued reading Charlie and the Chocolate Factory while creating some great candy advertisement of our own while cementing figurative language. As a reminder, please make sure to turn in the field trip forms for the Kennedy Space Center, and chaperones need to contact the teachers ASAP. Also, parents should be getting information soon about the Great Traveling Fair. The fair will be on December 20th.







4th Grade

4th grade has had a very busy week this week! All classes participated in a Mock FSA in order to get a baseline of where our writing ability is. Our field trip to see Newsies at the Orlando Repertory Theatre is next Thursday, October 19. Please remember to send your child with a disposable lunch on this day. If you have been selected to chaperone, please be sure to apply for the volunteer opportunity on ADDITIONS. Lastly, if your child will not be attending the field trip, please let his/her teacher know if he/she will be coming to school so plans can be made. Enjoy the three day weekend!

5th Grade

In 5th grade this week, we had our first STEAM day of the year. Students worked together in groups to build ghost rockets, create spooky haunted houses and candy corn catapults. Students had a blast working together cooperatively with their classmates!

In Ms. Jensen's class, students chose a planet or dwarf planet to research and create a model of. They presented their projects to the class this week. They were all so informative and creative! We learned that Pluto was named by an eleven-year-old girl from England, it takes Neptune over 164 years to orbit the sun, and many other amazing facts about planets.

6th/7th Grade

Ms. Kish's students re-created Ancient Egyptian scenes by making dioramas- (a model representing a scene with three-dimensional figures, either in miniature or as a large-scale museum exhibit.) Farmers, Scribes, Priests, Pharaohs were represented along with 10 specific facts (word document, brochure or Powerpoint.) *The Ancient Egyptians believed in the afterlife= the "ka" (life force) and the "ba" (soul). During the mummification process, the heart was left inside the body because it represented intelligence, feeling and emotion. The brain was removed and considered a waste of space!










After doing a lesson on the different types of models, Ms. Piontkowski's class built ziplines to show the application, usefulness, and fun of making physical models.


